How to Access Food Banks

To register for your first time visiting a food bank, please bring:

Medicare card for everyone in your household

• Identification with proof of address

Proof of monthly income (pay stub, bank statement, etc.)

 Proof of monthly expenses (rent, heat, electricity, water, phone bill, car payment, etc.)

Once you register, you will schedule a meeting for your next visit. During each meeting, you will meet a staff member to review your situation. You can receive items such as: bread, sweets, fruits and vegetables, and hygiene items. Staff will talk to you about your situation and need for food. Inform staff members of any allergies or diet requirements.



You also need to provide proof of identity and residency:

- Proof of Identity: You can provide a Birth Certificate, NB Driver's License, Passport, Student or Employee ID Card, other Provincial Health Card, or Canadian Native Status Card.
- Proof of Residence: You can provide a NB driver's license, vehicle registration, pay stub from an employer, utility bill, or a rental or lease agreement.

If you can, it is best to provide copies of these items, not the originals.

If you are new or returning to New Brunswick:

You must fill out the Application for Registration Form. You can find this form online or at Service New Brunswick. You will need to give your name, current address, a phone number, and details of why you were out of New Brunswick and why you are returning. Anyone 19 years and older must fill out this form.

You will also need to provide proof of status, identity, and residence:

- Proof of status in Canada: If you are Canadian, you can provide a Birth Certificate, Passport, Canadian Citizenship Card or Certificate, or a Canadian Native Status Card.
 If you are not a Canadian citizen, you can provide a Permit or a Permanent Residence Card or Confirmation of Permanent Residence.
- Proof of Identity: You can provide a Birth Certificate, NB Driver's License, Passport, Student or Employee ID Card, other Provincial Health Card, Canadian Native Status Card.
- Proof of Residence: You can provide a NB Driver's License, Vehicle Registration, Pay Stub from an Employer, Utility Bill, or a Rental or Lease Agreement.

- Date of birth
- Gender





KNOW YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS

 I can refuse to talk to the police or answer their questions, unless I am driving a car, or they say I broke the law. In those cases, I must give my name, birthdate and address, or show my ID, but I do not have to say any more.

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- I can say "no" if the police ask to search me or my things. Saying "no" does not mean I have something to hide.
- I can leave unless I am being detained or arrested.
- If I am being detained or arrested, I have a right to know why, and a right to speak privately to a lawyer without delay even if I can't afford to pay.
- I have a right to know a police officer's name and badge number.
- I can report a police officer who abuses me, swears at me, or violates my rights.
